ASS! Motor company Volkswagen has teamed up with US guitar manufacturer First Act for a unique guitar/car package. Customers in the US who buy any 2007 Volkswagen, including the Beetle, will receive a pimped First Act 'GarageMaster' electric guitar that can be amplified through their new car's stereo!

Each of the First Act guitars will be a one-off featuring the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) of the owner's Volkswagen and a scratchplate matching the finish of their car. The guitar will also carry the Volkswagen logo and a special 'V Dub' inlay. The package is completed by a guitar strap made of seat belt material, VW control knobs, a blue indicator light that 'matches the instrument panel lighting of Volkswagen vehicles,' VW logo guitar picks and a carrying case. The Volkswagen/First Act deal is only available in the US, but we just couldn't resist telling you about it. The G-2 (£699) features a two-piece mahogany body, a carved maple top, a one-piece mahogany neck, a Wilkinson GTB wrap-around bridge and a pair of Maverick's brand new 'Cybershift' active pickups.
